Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Point Reyes' (several) native to CA

Carex tumulicola/ Berkeley sedge native to Berkeley (4)

Carpenteria californica Elizabeth/ bush anemone (3) native to CA

Cercis occidentalis/western redbud native to CA

Dymondia margaretae/silver carpet non native (5+)

Thymus citriodorus/lime thyme nonnative (3)
