#### Zone 3

#### Zone 4

Fishing pier by Fruitvale Bridge

#### **KEY**

W indicates a bird found over water.

#: Abundance

The status of most species varies between watershed zones. Abundance categories reflect a species' status in appropriate habitat for the zones listed for that species.

A=abundant: almost always encountered, often occur in all zones

C=common: usually encountered in one or more zones

U=uncommon: occasionally encountered, often restricted to one or two

R=rare: rarely encountered, usually restricted to one zone

Pres: Presence

Gives a season, a time range in months, or resident status Resident: year-round resident, most nest in the watershed

Casual: one or more records but not recorded annually, generally not known to use habitat within the watershed for any length of time, often recorded as a flyover
